

CIPL, based in Mumbai, specializes in cyber

forensics, cyber security, software development, and research, addressing both national and international cyber forensic issues. The objective of this memorandum is to provide comprehensive training to interested students and researchers in the area of cyber security technology and planning. Over time, this laboratory will offer modified certification and diploma programs for undergraduate, postgraduate, and research programs. Additionally, the partnership aims to promote research and development activities in the field of cyber security through collaborative efforts. Gautam Buddha University and CIPL will organize educational programs including training sessions, workshops, seminars, conferences, and lectures at both national and international levels. They will actively contribute to research, knowledge creation, dissemination, and publication activities. During the occasion, Vice-Chancellor Prof. Ravindra Kumar Sinha highlighted that the establishment of this laboratory will not only benefit the university students but also provide knowledge to law enforcement agencies, private corporations, and private institutions. He stated that GBU aims to strengthen various potential areas of collaboration with CIPL, with the goal of enhancing the fields of cyber security and cyber forensics technology and education. Registrar Dr. Vishwas Tripathi emphasized the demand for cyber security in the age of artificial intelligence and machine learning. Representatives from all departments, members of the institution, and officials from CIPL participated in the meeting.

Vice Chancellor's Visit to New Holland Agriculture: On 21st May, Vice Chancellor Prof. Ravindra Kumar Sinha, visited a company named New Holland Agriculture, which provides manufacturing facilities for tractors and ground moving equipments in Mr. Sumantra Mukherjee, the Greater Noida. operational director of the company, briefed him about the company's history, philanthropic activities, safety equipment and conducive environment in the plant, and the company's sales and distribution channels in India and abroad. He also discussed about various tractor export channels in various countries and their key features. Mr. Aditya Ghildiyal, GM, HR of the company provided information about an apprenticeship program in science and engineering for female undergraduate students, which will soon be launched at Gautam Buddha University.

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Conference on Road Safety: On 23rd May, a state-wide campaign was launched by the Transport Department to raise awareness among youth to prevent accidents on the road. The initiative commenced with a Karma Yoga and Road Safety Conference at Gautam Buddha University. During this event, DM Mr. Manish Varma and Gautam Buddha University's Vice Chancellor Prof. Ravindra Kumar Sinha were present along with the Director General of the Indian Institute of Public Administration, Mr. Surendranath Tripathi.

Gautam Buddha University has established the country's first Digital Cyber Forensic Lab.

This lab is equipped with Sweden-Israel cyber tools for data recovery, that includes Data Extraction Tool which is a tool that automatically recovers lost data. It involves attaching a chip to retrieve all information from a neutralized drone such as who possesses its report, locations where the drone flew, and where photos were taken and sent. Additionally, this lab will not only recover drone data but also data from broken mobile phones, laptops, etc. If a mobile phone or laptop used by a suspected terrorist against the country is found destroyed, the data from it can also be recovered. After inserting some parts of the destroyed gadget into these tools, messages, emails, photos, files, and other information can be obtained. For this purpose, cyber tools from Sweden, Israel, and the United States will be utilized. Under the guidance of Prof. Nishakant Ojha of Gautam Buddha University's Drone Cyber Lab, Cyber Tech India Pvt. Ltd., based in Mumbai, is in the final stages of preparation for this lab. Dr. Nishakant Ojha, a specialist in Cyber and Aerospace Securities (Counter-terrorism-AI), explained that between 2020 and 2023, over 500 prohibited drones have crossed the country's border areas in Gujarat, Punjab, Rajasthan, and Jammu, carrying weapons like 9mm pistols, and 132 round guns and other things like heroin, opium etc. Drone activities have tripled in recent years compared to previous years. This lab has been prepared to prevent these activities. Another special feature of this lab is that it can also recover data from suicide drones sent from enemy countries. The drone's components will be collected in the lab and then its data will be recovered. These drones are fitted with improvised explosive devices (IEDs) and work similar to human bombs, exploding on their own after completing their mission. Detecting data from such drones has been a major challenge so far. This lab will prove effective in handling this. This will benefit all law enforcement agencies, including NIA, RAW, CBI, IB, Police, BSF, SOG, in uncovering any criminal or terrorist State and ED, ***

This certification signifies that Gautam Buddha University, a residential university with accommodation facilities for more than 5000 students, adheres to scientific standards for the quality assessment of food products, their production, storage, distribution,

Meeting the issue of Cyber Security **Improvement:** An important meeting was held on June 5 at the Broadcast Engineering Consultant India Ltd. (BECIL) office in Noida, which was attended by Vice Chancellor Prof. Ravindra Kumar Sinha, Dr. Arun Solanki, Dr. Aarti Gautam Dinker, Mr. Kartikey Tiwari, and representatives from BECIL. The meeting focused on recent strategic satellite hacks and potential responses, emphasizing the need for improvements in cyber security measures. Discussions also covered ongoing and future cyber forensic projects with the Indian Navy. A series centred on cyber forensics was proposed in the meeting and discussions were held about potential collaboration opportunities with space startups and integrating defence technologies into agricultural disaster management. Plans were outlined for establishing cyber forensic labs and the importance of labs for training and research among students was highlighted. The meeting also emphasized ongoing research and development efforts and discussed curriculum design and professional partnerships for forensic science programs. There were proposals for development programs in computer forensics and extensive plans for implementing comprehensive computer forensic training. The meeting concluded with decisions to initiate the process of establishing cyber forensic labs, exploring feasibility of regional developing labs, consultation and training programs for capacity building, and designing courses involving professional stakeholders. Follow-ups were planned for establishing cyber forensic labs, creating plans for regional lab visits and continuing discussions on collaborations with space startups and defencerelated projects.

Sustainable Celebration: The Department of Environmental Science at the School of Vocational Studies and Applied Sciences celebrated World Environment Day 2024 with great enthusiasm on June 5. This day is globally observed in remembrance of the historic 1972 United Nations Conference on the Human Environment, the first global environmental summit held in Stockholm, Sweden. Its goal was to secure and enhance the earth's environmental systems, raise awareness about environmental challenges, humaninduced climate change, and deteriorating global environmental conditions. The event marked the 51st

World Environment Day and featured environment friendly activities. A poster exhibition was organized showcasing highly informative and educational posters. The program's chief guest, Vice Chancellor Prof. Ravindra Kumar Sinha, engaged in discussions with students and teachers. He reviewed the departmental wall magazine "EcoVerse," which focuses on themes like land restoration, desertification, and drought resilience. Prof. Sinha advocated for the implementation of the United Nations' 17 Sustainable Development Goals and praised the decision of including environmental education in the National Education Policy 2020. He highlighted the university's initiative in starting a B.Sc. Environmental Science program and stressed the importance of integrating environmental education across various disciplines. He emphasized the need to integrate ongoing research efforts with sustainability in mind, as environmental protection is a collective responsibility.

Prof. N.P. Malkenia, Dean, School of Biotechnology and School of Vocational Studies and Applied sciences, emphasized the development of environmental conservation laws and policies. He explained the significance of various indigenous plant species such as 'Nakshatra Vatika,' 'Rashi Vatika,' and 'Navgrah Vatika,' which can easily be cultivated in home and kitchen gardens. He also highlighted the institution's environmental conservation efforts. Prof. Malkenia designated 2024 as the "Super Year for Sustainability," referencing six major global environmental events, including Rio Conferences and United Nations Environmental Assemblies. He praised Rachel Carson's pioneering work in raising awareness about historical environmental issues like acid rain in Scandinavia and deforestation in Germany. He commended former Indian Prime Minister Mrs Indira Gandhi for her environmental advocacy, which, he stated, helped India become a global representative of environmentally sensitive nations at events like the G20 Summit held in India. He mentioned the Environment Protection Act of 1986, which was a response to the aftermath of the 1984 Bhopal gas tragedy, and cited A.J.P Taylor who famously stated, "Nothing is inevitable until it happens,". He concluded with an example of a clay pot, which, when overturned, spills its contents outside, saying, "Problems may seem small but their consequences are long-term."

A notable feature of this program was minimal plastic use. Dr. Bhaswati Banerjee, Head of the Department of Environmental Science, along with other faculty members and students, participated in discussion sessions on relevant issues such as biodiversity conservation, rainwater harvesting systems, large-scale solar panel installations etc.

Lamp lighting during two-day national conference on the topic "Curriculum for Psychology through Indian Knowledge System

National Conference: A two-day national conference on the topic "Curriculum for Psychology through Indian Knowledge System" was organized jointly by the Centre for Hindu Studies and the Department of Psychology and Mental Health. 
Samsung Innovation campus- 2nd season
