Introduction:

The Department of Social Work in the School of Humanities and Social Sciences in Gautam Buddha University started in 2011. The Department of Social Work is offering Bachelor of Social Work (BSW) and Master of Social Work (MSW) programmes. BSW and MSW programmes are designed to contribute towards the developmental need and to produce efficient professionals for the development/ humanitarian sector as a whole. The syllabus is developed keeping in view the international standards and professional ethics that would give wider understanding about the basic human rights, the developmental needs and services for the people living in different cultural contexts to facilitate healthy living and well-being. The student would develop the knowledge and skills of working with a diverse group of population in various set-ups like, communities, schools, industries and hospitals. They would also be able to analyze the problems through critical understanding of the situation and facilitate appropriate measures through social work intervention. These programmes would also enable the students to work as independent social work professionals in various demanding situations. Specifically the students would develop competencies in research, documentation, evaluation, planning, designing, administration, and social work interventions.

Mission:

- To nurture and develop dynamic and competent social work professionals to address the challenges and concerns of the 21st century that facilitates changes at the level of policy formation and academic advancement.
- To inculcate research aptitude, analytical ability, innovative programming and thrusting on development models for social work practice in different spheres of human existence.

Field Work Practicum:

The field work is an integral part of BSW and MSW training programmes providing exposure to a variety of professional situations of working with individuals, groups, and communities. The field work gives an opportunity to practice the theoretical aspects taught under the scheme and helps the individual to develop professional social work skills. Field work helps in developing social consciousness, sensitivity and empathy towards human sufferings and problems. From the first semester onwards the students shall be placed for the concurrent individual field work under the supervision of faculty members in various types of agencies and communities so as to practice the methods of social work. Each student will be required to put in 16 hours of field work (14 hours in field + 2 hours of reporting) per week which will be spread over two days. The department will be providing specific guidelines for submission of various reports from time to time. Weekly reports and summary reports of the semester have to be submitted by the students to the respective faculty member (field supervisor) within a stipulated time. Field work training is done through seven courses in the BSW programme and five courses in the MSW programme.
