The maximum period for completion of research work and submission of thesis shall be five years. Ph.D. with a Post Graduate degree in First Division (60%) or equivalent in Engineering/Technology, Sciences and Management, and 55% percent in Social Sciences, Humanities, and Law or equivalent in the appropriate discipline and Under Graduate degree with minimum 55% marks or equivalent. A relaxation of 5% in marks or equivalent relaxation in grade is allowed in the case of SC/ST/Physically Challenged candidates. Similar relaxation in age, if applicable, will be permissible as per U.P. government norms.

## 1.2 Professional Experience Essential

### (a) For Professor

Minimum 10 years of Teaching/ Research/ Industrial experience with experience of teaching at postgraduate level.

The candidate should have at least ten research publications in refereed reputed journals and should have evidence of independent research.

The candidate should have experience of guiding Ph.D. research (at least one Ph.D. completed)

The candidate should have minimum API score as prescribed by UGC.

A person with exceptional eminence in related field may be appointed directly as professor. In such cases other essential qualifications may be relaxed. The selection committee's decision should be in the nature of speaking order. The selection committee should record explicitly the nature of eminence of the applicant.

Minimum 08 years of Teaching/Research/Industrial experience at the level of Asst. Professor or equivalent position.

The candidate should also have at least five research publications in refereed reputed journals.

The candidate should have minimum API score as prescribed by UGC.

#### (c) For Assistant Professor

The candidate should have a minimum 03 years of post Ph.D. Teaching/Research/ Industrial experience.

The candidate must have cleared the National Eligibility Test (NET) or equivalent as accredited by UGC or have been awarded a Ph. D. Degree in accordance with the University Grants Commission (Minimum Standards and Procedure for Award of Ph.D. Degree Regulations).

The candidate should have minimum API score as prescribed by UGC.

#### 1.3 **Desirable Experience and Recognitions**

#### For Professor

Fellowship of Eminent Academies, Distinguished Awards and other recognitions, and experience of visiting faculty/scientist in reputed national and international institution.

#### **ADJUNCT FACULTY**

In alignment with global best practices Adjunct Faculty will be classified into two groups

- (a) Domain Experts (with same requirement as 'Recognized Teachers' in the current ordinances
- (b) Experts from industry with same requirement as adjunct faculty in the earlier ordinances. For conducting an Instructional course (full or part thereof)

Due to exigencies in faculty availability and/ or to provide specific specialized inputs, Adjunct Faculty are invited to teach a major part or all of a normal course. The identification of the Adjunct faculty will be the responsibility of the concerned Areas in consultation with the concerned Department Head with the approval of the Vice Chancellor. The rate of honorarium and other terms shall be as decided by the VC/ University Administration.

Note: Any other regulation of statutory bodies such as BCI, RCI, NCTE, etc. shall apply for the appointment of teachers in the concerned school/department, wherever necessary. Normally standards laid down by UGC will not be violated and provisions of other bodies will apply only if they prescribe standards higher than UGC.
